
Clothespin Snowman Craft

If you think your clothespins look pretty boring, why not give them a quirky makeover? This clothespin craft is super cute and these little fellows will look great pretty much everywhere, holding your favorite notes, holding gift tags and more!

What you will need:

- Natural Wood Clothespins
- Yarn in Various Colors
- Glue
- Orange Mini Pompoms
- White Paint
- Paint Brush
- Black Marker
- Scissors





- 2. Take a short piece of yarn and wrap it around the clothespin, making a bow. Add a drop of glue to secure it.
- 3. Now take a black marker and draw two black eyes, mouth and black buttons on the snowman body.
- 4. Glue on an orange mini pompom for the nose.
- 5. Wait for the glue to dry and your clothespin snowman craft is done.
