'A friend said to me recently, "Movies and television feed you the story. Other mediums make you work for it."

'I want my children to work for it. Don't get me wrong. We watch movies, we watch TV and we have a great time doing that. But I also want my children to grow up believing that reading is a normal part of everyday life. I want to equip my children with minds that are adept at reading and writing, imagining and creating. I want them to be familiar with the mental and emotional process of reading books. I believe that a love of reading is a gift that will improve the quality of their life for all of their days.'

- 1. Let Your Kids See You Reading. Our Children are our shadows, our mimickers. Let them see mom and dad reading often.
- 2. **Do Not Pressure Your Children to Read by a Certain Age.** Teach them to love to read. Back off when they get frustrated but respond attentively when they express interest. Be patient and have faith.
- 3. **Read to Them. A Lot.** Read to them every day. Read books you love and they love. Your consistency and enthusiasm will pay off.
- 4. **Go to the Library.** Let them pick out books to bring home and get them a library card. Yes, it may take them a while to learn to be quiet but they will learn.
- 5. **Make Books Readily Available to Them.** Provide them with books they love and enjoy. Remember that your first goal is to teach them to love to read.
- **6.** Let Them Take Books to Bed. Just Books. The sight of them settled in with a book should just fill your heart.
- 7. Lastly, Make Time for Reading. It is easy to over schedule. Slow down enough and turn the screens off long enough to make space for reading. If they say they are bored, suggest a book to read.

I hope these ideas help you and your children on a journey towards a life and love of reading. The possibilities, the adventure, the knowledge awaits!
