



This year all our teachers successfully graduated from a TCIT training program with the support of our Mental Health Consultants at Kinder Konsulting. Teacher-Child Interaction Training (TCIT) is a research-tested classroom prevention & intervention program that decreases disruptive student behaviors, increases child protective factors (self-control, initiative, and attachment), and improves social-emotional functioning. This training has been incredibly impactful as it utilizes a bug-in-the-ear for supporting and coaching teachers in-the-moment while working with their students making the learning come to life in their daily practice.

Outdoor play, whether organized or not, is highly beneficial for preschool-aged children and so critical to healthy child development. For 84 years, Winter Park Day Nursery (WPDN) has been dedicated to changing the lives of young children by developing their minds AND their bodies. The area that encompasses WPDN's preschool playground was built over 20 years ago and has been well loved for all those years and was in need of replacement. Thanks to the support of our community, we were able to upgrade both refreshed, playgrounds with safe new. equipment, ground cover and fencing.


