



Put a Doctor's Kit on Your Gift List

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Gift lists are endless, filled with this gadget and that "must-have" toy. If you're looking for something to fill out your gift list, here is an unlikely solution I swear by: A doctor's kit.

What's so wonderful about a doctor's kit?

1. Brain-building imaginative play.

Imaginative play like the kind they'll do with a doctor's kit is where it's at if you want a child who can get along with others, self-regulate, think creatively and solve complex problems. And it's fun!

2. The opportunity to practice deep breathing.

Our doctor's kit allows lots of opportunities to coach deep breathing. "Time to listen to your lungs. Watch your tummy go waaaay out while you breathe in." Broken leg? Deep breaths while we set the bone. Need a shot? Pretzel together. Sick visit for a bad cough? Deep breath with lots of dramatic, fake coughing.

3. The ability to process a scary situation in a safe and fun way.

Active calming through deep breathing and helpful affirmations will help soothe an upset system. Replace "you're okay" with "you're safe". Validate the child's experience through empathy. It feels like confident comfort: "You are safe." "You can handle this." "We'll get through this together."

When playing doctor, be present with your child and enjoy!

Having fun and connecting is the most important (and most beneficial) part of playing with a doctor's kit.

Please check your child's parent folder every day. There is important information there! Also, make sure your child always has a change of clothes and diapers/pull-ups, if necessary. Thank You!

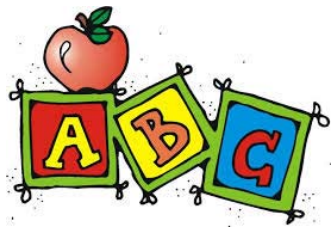
Pixie Butterflies

Back to School Bus

If you're looking for a super cute and fun Back to School craft idea, check out this school bus created out of wooden craft sticks! It makes a perfect keepsake to display those priceless first day of school pictures.



Here's what you'll need:

- ◆ Jumbo Wood Craft Sticks (5.75")
- ◆ Skinny Wood Craft Sticks (4.5")
- ◆ Yellow Craft Paint & Paintbrush/Sponge
- ◆ Craft Glue & Scissors
- ◆ Black Craft Foam
- ◆ Letter Stickers, Buttons, Gems for Decoration

1. For each bus, you'll need 3 jumbo sticks and 5 skinny sticks. Paint all sticks yellow and let dry. Cut about an inch off of 4 of the skinny wood sticks. Arrange the 4 short skinny sticks so they are evenly spaced vertically. Glue the longer uncut skinny stick across the top of the other four. Glue the jumbo sticks across the bottom of the skinny sticks as shown in the photo above.
2. Cut circles out of the black craft foam. Embellish wheels with buttons, or paper brads. Glue another button or craft gem for a headlight. Add lettered stickers to the front if desired.
1. Attach photos in the "windows" of the bus. Another further step would be to glue magnets to the back so that you could display on the fridge or another metal surface.
