


Alternatives to the Phrase "Calm Down"

Leprechaun Paper Plate Mask

St. Patrick's Day is around the corner and we wanted to create something fun to celebrate! Check out the **St. Patrick's Day Leprechaun Paper Plate Mask** that is fun and super easy to make! I guarantee your kiddos will love these and will play with them day after day!

Here's what you'll need: Paper plate Green, yellow, and black construction paper Orange paint Gold glitter Craft glue Yarn Scissors

- 1. Cut out a circle in the middle of the paper plate.
- 2. Have your child paint the paper plate orange and allow to dry completely.
- 3. If you have a younger child you can cut out the hat pieces for them, but if your child is ready to cut the pieces themselves go ahead and draw a small rectangle on a black construction paper, a hat from green construction paper, and a small square with the yellow paper. Allow your child to cut out the pieces for a great fine motor skills activity. For the gold buckle, help your child cut another square inside to create a thin buckle for your hat. Glue it all together.
- 4. For some extra sparkle you can also add gold glitter to your leprechaun's hat buckle.
