1 Japan

2 Italy

She is offered special homemade gifts and fresh pastries. Make a cupcake liner flower craft to gift mom for Mother's Day. Using a cupcake liner, paper, scissors, child's photo and glue, they can create a beautiful flower. Your child can add a special message on the back of the flower.

3 Brazil

Mother's Day is a very important holiday in Brazil, coming second to Christmas. It's often a multi-generational celebration including grandmas and aunts. Desserts are a must for Mother's Day and also flowers. Together, visit your local farmer's market and pick out some beautiful flowers for your mom. You can also spend the day at a farm that offers u-pick flowers. Take plenty of pictures then create your own bouquet.





4 Peru

Peruvians have similar traditions as Americans for Mother's Day like buying gifts and cards for their mothers. However, the most important way many celebrate this holiday is by visiting the cemetery to honor those who have passed away. Peruvians decorate the graves of their loved ones then host a celebration. For the month of May, the Caterpillar classroom will be learning about ocean animals. And working on a special project for Mom and not to forget we are still working on our Gross Motor Skills





Have your child help out in the kitchen to make their mother's favorite meal. You can also play her favorite music while having a dance party.



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Caramel Apple Craft

Looking for a fun and easy, any time of year craft? These caramel apples are fun to make and messy just like the real ones.

Supplies Needed:

- Apple Cardstock Cutouts
- Shaving Cream
- White Glue
- Brown Food Coloring
- Googly Eyes
- Black Marker
- Sprinkles
- Large Craft Stick



Instructions:

Step 1: Cut out apple shapes from cardstock paper.

Step 2: Turn paper apple upside down and glue craft stick to the back of the apple.

Step 3: Mix equal parts shaving cream and glue, then slowly add in brown food coloring until it becomes a caramel color.

Step 4: Set out the puffy caramel paint, apples and sprinkles.

Step 5: Paint the caramel onto the apples and add some sprinkles.

Step 6: Add googly eyes and a smile—then let fully dry.
